## USDA advances in development and delivery of electronic certification at U.S. - Canada land border port crossings



For imports of Canadian animals to the United States:

- 1. The pilot project for Electronic Exchange of Export Certificates (EEEC) for export of cattle and bison from Canada to the United States was implemented at four ports of entry 2014 (3 in British Columbia and 1 in Alberta).
- 2. Certificates continue to be issued and authenticated through the EEEC platform.

# USDA advances in development and delivery of electronic certification at U.S. – Canada land border port crossings



### For exports of U.S. animals to Canada:

- 1. Breeding and feeder cattle export certificates with VEHCS-generated <u>electronic signatures</u> are accepted by CFIA through designated ports
- All other commodity certificates may be issued by accredited veterinarians in VEHCS, then printed and signed by APHIS
- 3. To date, over 28,000 VEHCS certificates have been generated for animals exported to Canada
- 4. The VEHCS system continues to be improved to meet the needs of exporters, internal users, and trading partners.
- 5. APHIS staff also continue to engage in discussions with trading partners on acceptance of VEHCS for priority markets.

## On-Truck Canadian Feeder Cattle Inspections

As of October 1, 2018, this process is available at all of the APHIS Veterinary Services staffed, land border ports of entry between the U.S. and Canada



### On-Truck Canadian Feeder Cattle Inspections



- Offer an on-truck inspection option for Canadian exporters of feeder cattle to the U.S.
- Exporter creates an importation request in VS Process Streamlining system with accurate electronic ID in advance of the import
- Port veterinarian verifies 10-20% of the RFID tags, "CAN" brands and performs visual health assessment from outside the truck

### **On-Truck Canadian Feeder Cattle Inspections**



Port personnel are readily able to verify ID, brands and health status

Total inspection time is reduced by more than half compared to the offloading process.

Process also reduces the time to process paperwork

Improved ID data capture and traceability within our federal import data system

### Streamlined On-Truck Canadian Feeder Bison Inspection Pilot

- UHF tagging and on-truck inspection
- Saves time and cost for the importers
- Eliminates need to coordinate inspections on arrival at the destination
- Allows for increased safety for the animals and inspectors

# Case by case management of non-compliant, non-tagged, or down animals in trailer/conveyance

### The options include:

- 1. Allow the truck to go back to Canada to offload the non-compliant animal, and represent same day with the same health certificate.
- 2. Offload non-compliant animals and hold at the port of entry
  - Used when the return to origin is more time consuming
  - Requires trucking company to collect and return the animal to Canada.
- 3. Refuse entry
  - Used when multiple non-compliant animals and/or documents
  - This is a full return and the need to start over with the import.
